KNBH has purchased 26 features and 48 serial films from Hollywood Television Service, subsidiary to Republic Pictures Corp., for a mere \$77,700. Films will start showing locally around Oct. 1 and assures KNBH of one new film a week for two years, since

one feature or one serial will be shown each week. Contract will be signed as soon as negotiations are completed with James Caesar Petrillo, boss of the Musicians Union, who wants a 10 per cent slice of the capital outlay for his musicians' retirement fund.

**BERKELEY, July 11**—(U.P.) A moderate earthquake was recorded today on the University of California seismograph at 11:33.15 a. m., PDT. Seismograph Station Assistant John Meeker said it probably was located near the Andes mountains in northern Chile, 5500 miles from here. It was still being recorded three hours after the initial shock.
