Tele-Vues By TERRY VERNON

We were privileged to attend the first showing of the new fall models of the Westinghouse TV line at the Ambassador Hotel the other night and we saw some beautiful sets.

Of primary interest to more than 750 dealers who were assembled in the Embassy Room was the color and slave set which will be produced "when and if color television becomes general."

There is no production on the model now, but the fact that Westinghouse engineers have worked out plans shows that TV is rapidly becoming a big boy. They also showed a converter to sell at less than \$20 so color telecasts can be received in black and white.

The fall outlook is very good for TV with the coast-to-coast network ready for usage and opening next month; plus the coming of the world series. We'll also get a whole lot of "live" sports and dramatic shows from the East.

One of the major things we noted was the lower prices for sets. This was explained as due to the increased efficiency of production and the simplifying of the circuits.

If you do not have a TV set (and we find that many of our readers, surprisingly enough, do not own TV) you should get one prior to the advent of the major coast-to-coast telecasts.

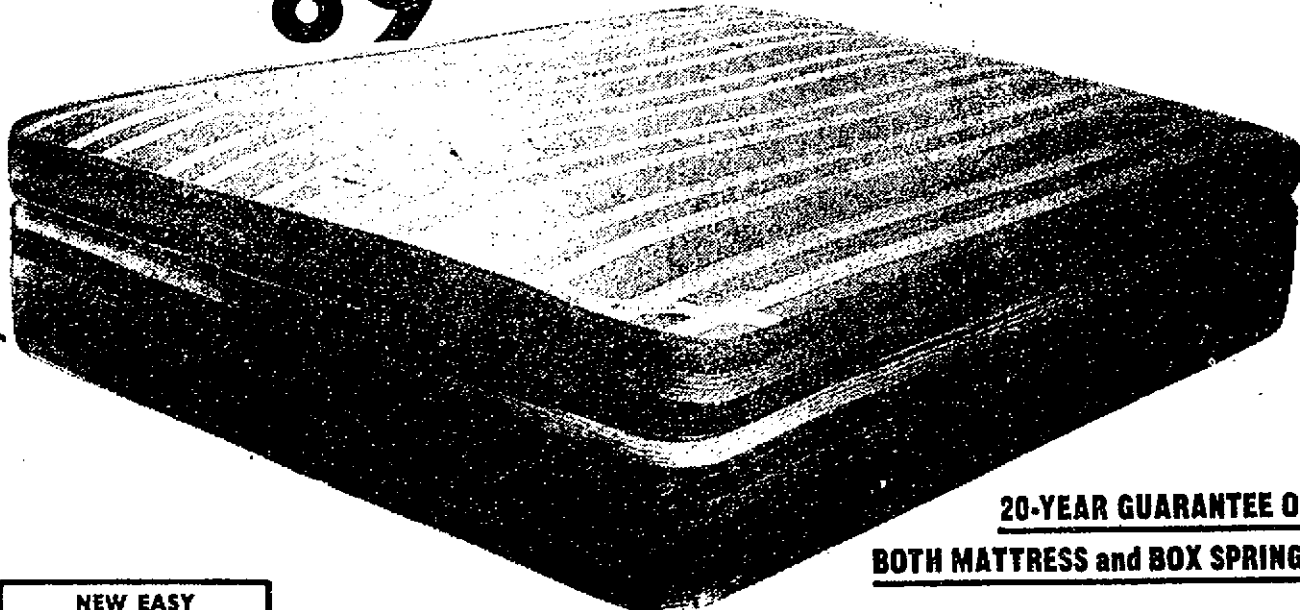
Navy Recruiters On Overtime
