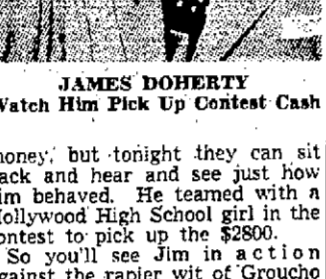
TV Tele Views
