

### Blood Tests 'Out' In Divorce Case

Official Referee Frank J. Cress yesterday disagreed with scientific blood tests in determining legitimacy.

In trial of a divorce action before him, the husband sought a decree of absolute divorce and a judgment declaring that a child born to his wife was not his.

As part of the evidence on the question of legitimacy, the report of a scientific blood test was accepted as evidence. The report stated that the test indicated the father of the child had been the husband.

However, Justice Cress ruled that the child was legitimate and ordered the father to pay \$12 a week support. He granted the divorce decree.

### Teachers' Union Backs Mrs. Dawson For Senate Post

In a resolution citing her "loyal support of the teachers viewpoint in educational controversies," the Syracuse Federation of Teachers (AFL) Monday night unanimously endorsed Mrs. Veronique Dawson's candidacy for the state senate.

Mrs. Dawson, member of the board of education, is the Democratic nominee to oppose State Sen. John H. Hughes, Republican incumbent.

### Election Inspectors Voted \$2 Increase For Referendum

Election inspectors who worked thru the special advisory referendum on the sales tax will be paid \$18 instead of \$8 for three days of their registration day work this year.

The increase was voted by the common council this year to give workers \$9 for the referendum day work.

The council also passed a non-competitive bidding ordinance that brought no objection from its members when Commissioner William J. Haxton wrote that he could buy sheet steel on the open market at a price cheaper than he had received in two bids.

Haxton said he had shopped around and discovered a source where steel could be purchased at the going market price. In bids, he said offerings to the city were made two times at a higher price.

The council also: Received a Reminding letter from Corporation Counsel George L. Richardson noting that federal rent controls will expire Dec. 31 unless affirmative action is taken by the city before that date. Authorized the department of audit to trade in three check-writers toward the purchase of new equipment and the purchase of a piano for Salem Hyde School with half the cost to be paid by the P-TA's Mothers Club.
