3 Lutheran Groups May Be Merged

COLUMBUS, O. (AP)—The American Lutheran Church opened the way last night for merger of more than 1,500,000 members of three Lutheran groups into one church.

Delegates to the A.L.C.'s national convention approved resolutions creating a nine-member committee to discuss merger with the Evangelical Lutheran Church, which has more than 813,000 members, and the United Evangelical Lutheran Church, with 46,000. The A.L.C. has more than 700,000 members.

If the merger is effected, it would make the combined church the third largest Lutheran group in the country, ranking behind the United Lutheran Church in America, with 1,900,000 members, and the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, with 1,677,000.

Both the Evangelical and the United Evangelical churches have appointed similar nine-member committees to discuss the merger. The joint union committee will have two years to negotiate before reporting to the next national conventions of the three churches in 1952.

A spokesman for the A.L.C. said the merger, if approved, probably can not be effected before 1956.

The A.L.C., in its resolution, also opened the way for two other members of the American Lutheran Conference — to which the A.L.C. belongs — to enter the merger negotiations. The other two members are the Augustana Lutheran Church with 400,000 members and the Lutheran Free Church with 55,000.

The resolution empowered the nine-member committee to invite the other two churches to merger negotiations if the Evangelical and United Evangelical Churches approve.

The more than 1,000 A.L.C. delegates also took another step toward unity with a separate Lutheran group. They adopted the "common confession" set down by the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

The "common confession" is a statement of common doctrine to which both churches can agree. An A.L.C. spokesman said the statement bridges many disputes over doctrines which have arisen between the two groups.
