

Joe Louis Reported Ready To Continue Ring Career

Ex-Champion After a New Charles Bout Will Fight Brion And Lee Savold

NEW YORK (AP)—It looks as if Joe Louis is going to keep on fighting until he gets one more shot at his old heavyweight title.

From reliable sources it was learned today that the Brown Bomber is planning a series of big bouts which he hopes will earn him another crack at Champion Ezzard Charles.

If all goes well, the 36-year-old Louis may take on Argentina's Cesar Brion in Chicago in late November or early December, followed swiftly by appearances in Detroit and New York.

NIN RETROIT, his probable opponent would be Lee Oma, the veteran contender from Buffalo. In New York's Madison Square Garden he might face Ricky Marciano, the undefeated Brockton, Mass. slugger.

Then, if victorious in all three, Louis would be primed to face Charles again in an outdoor fight in Yankee Stadium.

The prospects of a huge television-radio fee, far surpassing the \$144,000 he pulled out for last month's Charles-Louis scrap, is one of the tempting lures for a Louis return.

Other possible foes include Lee Savold, British-recognized heavyweight king from Englewood, N. J., and Tommy Farr, the comebacking Welsh oldtimer.

Louis was not available early today for his say on these reports, which came from those usually in the know. The Bomber attended a function in Norfolk, Va., last night.

WELTERWEIGHT Champion Ray Robinson, a close friend of Joe's, told the press at a Boston luncheon yesterday that Louis has been signed to meet Brion in Chicago Stadium, Nov. 29. Sugar Ray said an official of the International Boxing Club had shown him a statement from VNU F. L. YQ ODWIK, contract for the fight. Louis, incidentally, is a partner and director in the I. B. C.

Robinson's statement that a contract had been signed brought vigorous denials from Harry Markson, managing director of the I. B. C., from Truman Gibson, Louis' financial adviser and secretary of the I. B. C., and from Hymie Wallman, manager of Brion. All three said no papers had been signed.

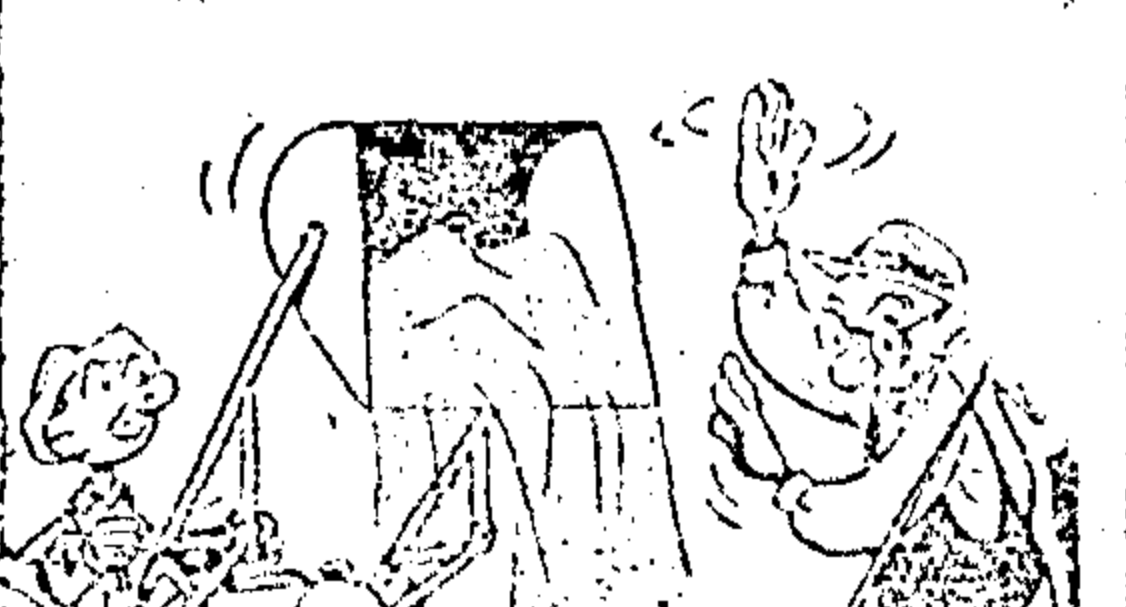
Alfred Team Too Fast for Colgate

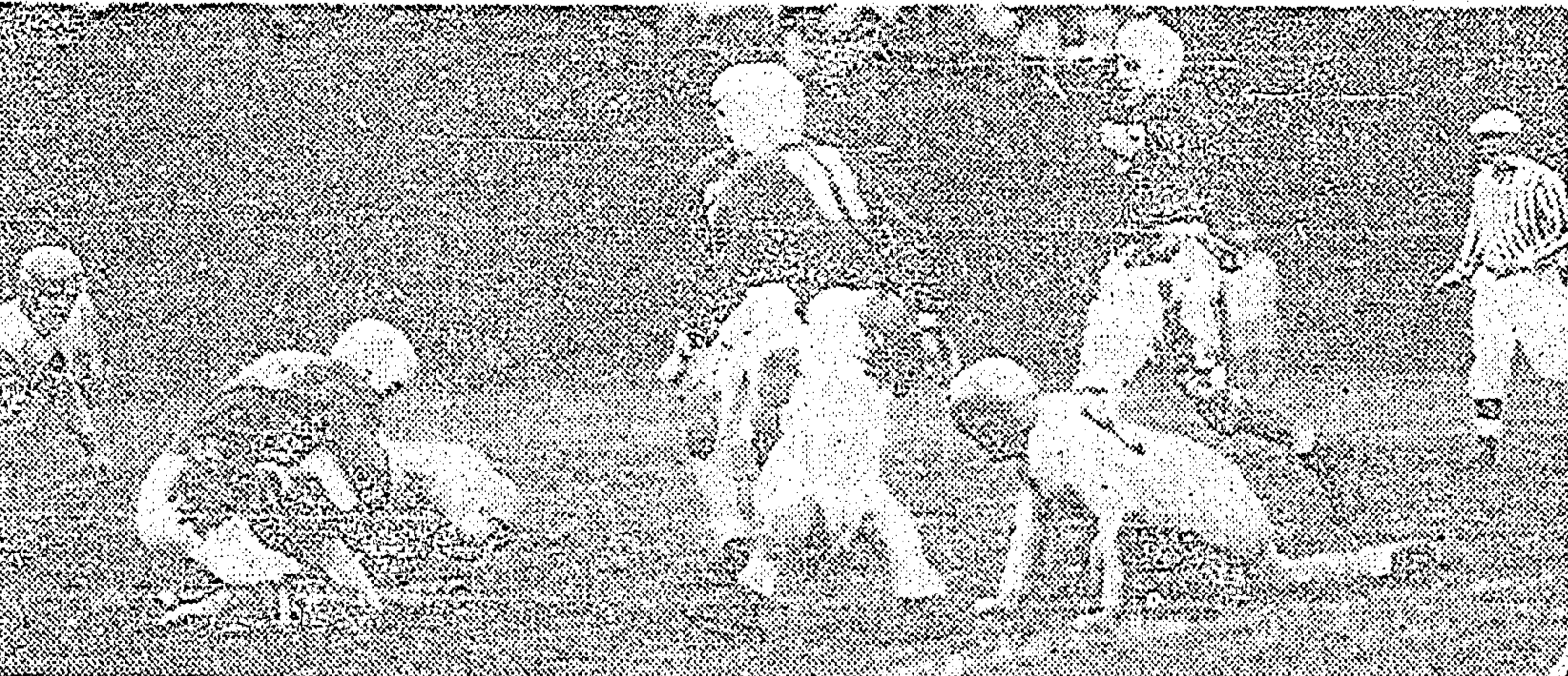

Orange Frosh Defeat Penn State Cubs, 14-0

SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY'S football followers had reason to be hopeful today for the future of the Orange varsity on the gridiron, after Coach Les Dye's yearling squad opened its season with a 14-0 victory over Penn State cubs yesterday at Hendricks Field.

DESPITE A MUDDY field and a series of fumbles caused by a heavy, wet ball, the Dye charges impressed as they completely outplayed the visitors. The Orange threatened several times, but misplays prevented scores, while the defense held the young Lions to a minus total in the rushing department. Fifteen first downs were credited the Orange, five to the Lions.

A strong forward wall, including Tackles Bob Fleck and Les McClelland, and End Jim George, cleared large holes and blocked ably on offense, and the Orange also exhibited a defense that kept the Pennsylvanians at bay.

LEFT HALFBACK Bob Leberman of Hamburg sparked in the Orange attack, figuring in several long runs, and scoring a touchdown, as well as returning punts in flashy style, before 2,000 fans who watched the battle on a cold, raw day.

Quarterback Bruce Yancey of Bellerose, L.I. scored the first Orange touchdown in the second quarter, when he swung around his left end for five yards to climax a 29-yard advance. Earlier in this period, Bob Dobrowski fumbled on the Lions' three-yard

Looking—and—Listening

ALTHOUGH Vaughn Monroe has waited until this season to enter television, the singing maestro hasn't been sitting idly by while the new medium was building.

For a long time Monroe has been studying the visual tricks of the game. "It's a lot different than a stage presentation," he says, "because the audience takes in a stage appearance as a whole panorama, so to speak."

"Television, at least half the time, involves closeups of a group. That's a whole of a difference, too. For one thing, it means more attention to detail, to little things that would be lost in a broad stage show."

To prepare for this, Monroe says, "We've long been using our stage dates to sort of road-test ourselves for television." During his recent tour, which brought the entire troupe to Syracuse, the Monroe aggregation stressed variety, elaborate costumes for the girls, and some production numbers like a comedy bit where the leader appeared as Mope-Along-Monroe, a take-off on movies he's been making.

With Monroe on the TV series are the Regular Moon Maids and Moon Men and comedy-singer Ziggy Talent, augmented by singers Shaye Cogan and Ada Lynne.

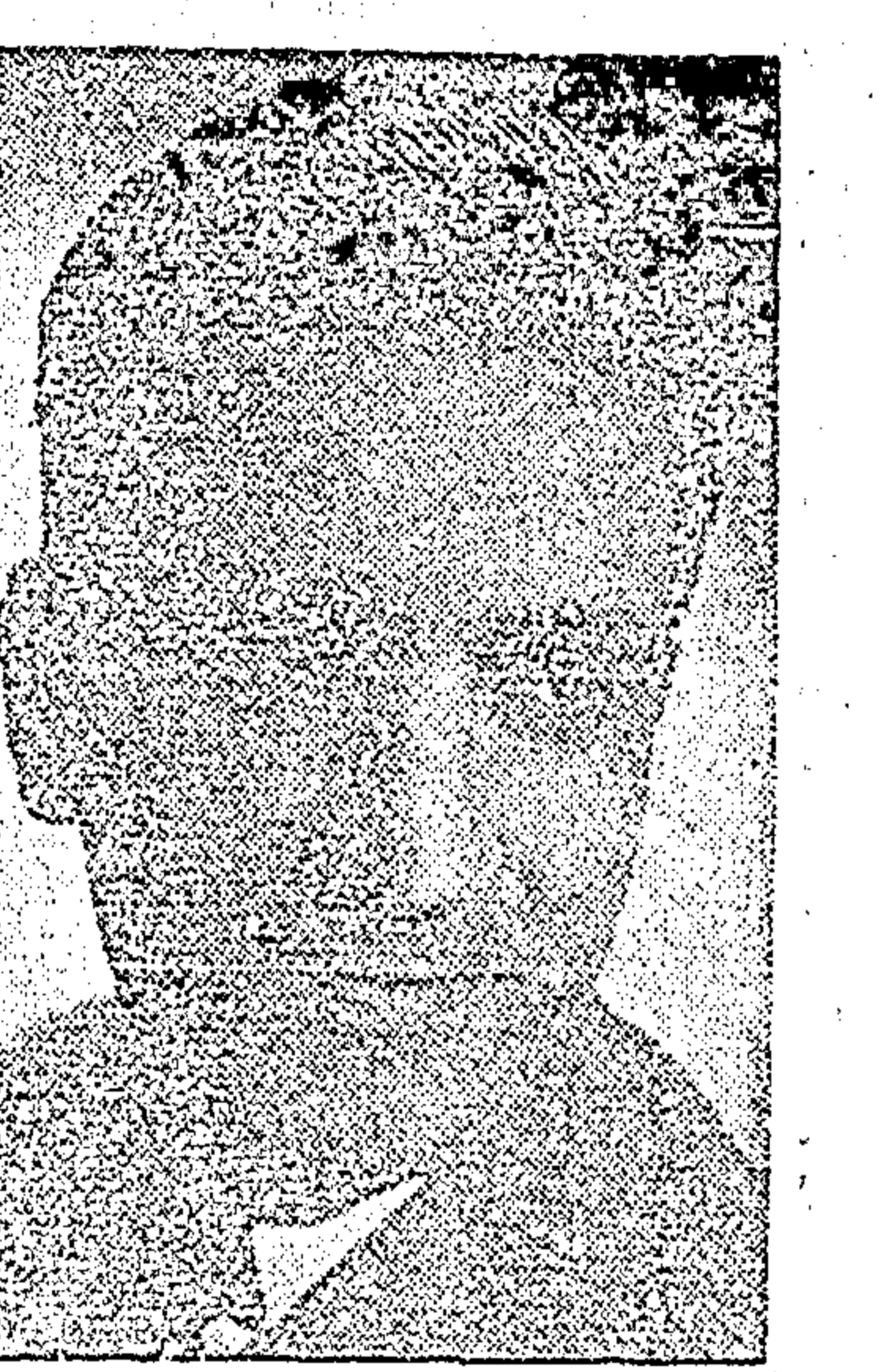
