## PEACE TELECAST IS ALL BUT THAT

Gavel Sounds Blows Seen Around the Nation

Some real two-fisted western action—but not the usual cowboy type seen on television—was provided millions of Americans yesterday afternoon in the telecast of the opening session of the Japanese peace treaty conference from San Francisco.

Representatives of the Soviet bloc of nations opened a fiery torrent of words with the first rap of Secretary of State Dean Acheson's gavel, and the cameras captured every angry gesture and every facial grimace in the two-hour debate which followed.

Any illusions that the ways of international diplomacy are suave and polite must have been dispelled in the minds of persons who followed the television account of the San Francisco session.

Maintains Ig. Dignity

Secretary Acheson, sitting high above the conferees in his role of presiding officer, maintained an air of dignity and a composure that stood out in contrast with the arm-waving tactics of the Soviet delegates.

Highlight of the conference telecast was provided by Polish Delegate Stefan Wierblowski early in the session when he used the five minutes allocated to him on the platform for a harangue against the United States and other democratic nations.

Acheson rapped the gavel on the expiration of the five minutes, but Wierblowski, a sharp-faced man with a tousled mane of gray hair refused to stop talking. Acheson reminded the Pole that his time was up and then gave a British delegate the floor for a five-minute talk.

Vie for Attention

Wierblowski kept right on talking, even after the English representative had joined him in front of the microphone, and the television audience had the rare sight of two highly placed international figures maneuvering for the attention of the conference.

Wierblowski finally relinquished the floor, but the incident provoked one of the few looks of outright annoyance to cross Acheson's face. The Secretary spanked the gavel on the desk smartly, stroked the mallet in such a meditative way that nobody in the television audience would have been particularly surprised had Acheson bounced it off the Polish delegate's head.

In the odd moments when Gromyko did not hold the speaking platform, the cameras provided close-ups of him in his chair, flanked by other members of the Russian delegation. He appeared the same familiar unsmiling.

Acheson Warns Gallery

Members of the gallery audience must have found the proceedings as exciting as did those in the home audience because their applause and demonstrations of opinion led Acheson to reprimand them several times. At one point he warned the audience that further demonstrations of approval or disapproval would lead to a clearing of the hall.

"We must retain the dignity of the conference," he said.

Illustrating another change brought about by television in the field of international diplomacy, Acheson and many of the delegations wore sun glasses throughout the opening conference to shield their eyes from the glare of the TV klieg lights.

National television coverage of the San Francisco peace treaty meeting was made possible by the State Department, which encouraged the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. to set up a temporary microwave relay channel from the west coast to the Atlantic seaboard in time for the conference.

Judging from the reaction of viewers who watched diplomats of the Soviet bloc of nations at work, the State Department knew well what it was doing when it made the coverage possible.
